This makes a huge difference to our school and the programs we can offer. Apollo Bay P-12 College makes every effort to keep Parent Payments affordable for all families. This year, there has been <u>no</u> increase to contribution costs. Furthermore, where a family has three or more children enrolled at the school, a 20% discount is applicable.

The school relies upon voluntary parent financial contributions to meet the difference between funds from the Department of Education and our budgeted expenditure each year. Parent Contributions and local fundraising also allow us to fully fund the maintenance of, and improvements to, buildings and grounds.

- SUPPORT FOR FAMILIES

Apollo Bay P-12 College understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- **Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)** this yearly allowance of \$150/\$250 per primary/secondary student can be applied to camps, sports and excursions. Families holding a means-tested concession card (or temporary foster parents) are eligible to apply. For more information, please click on the following link or pick up a form from the office: https://www.vic.gov.au/camps-sports-and-excursions.
- School Saving Bonus (2025) the one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus provides families with support for educationrelated costs, such as school activities and/or school uniforms and textbooks for children enrolled in a government school from Prep to Year 12 in 2025. Families will receive an email from the Department of Education in Term 4 2024 with their School Saving Bonus information and access to an online system. Families can choose how to use and allocate the \$400 bonus – on school activities (eg camps and excursions), to purchase uniforms, or a mixture.
- Uniform Support <u>State Schools Relief (SSR)</u> provides assistance with uniforms and other essential items for students who are experiencing financial disadvantage because of short-term crisis or long-term chronic need.
- Payment Plans available for extra-curricular items and activities.

Edrolo Subscription – see also attached Edrolo Payment Portal Letter 2025

Cost: \$35 per subject for online support (or \$85 for online support and printed textbook, some subjects only) **Payment:** Online via Edrolo Payment Portal (using student's existing Edrolo account or activate a new account) **Due Date:** Payment must be made by 15 January 2025. If payment has not been received by or prior to 15 January, your child will be blocked from accessing all of their Edrolo courses until the balance has been paid in full (no later than 12 March 2025).

How do I activate my child's Edrolo account?

If your child has accessed Edrolo recently, their account will be active and you can log in with them as normal to pay through the Payment Portal as per Step 6 below. If your child is new to Edrolo, please follow the instructions below first:

- 1. Go to: www.edrolo.com.au/activate/dhc-ptn
- 2. Enter your child's surname and check that it recognises their correct first name
- 3. Enter your child's school email address and choose a secure password that they will remember
- 4. Click 'Let me in'
- 5. Edrolo will send a confirmation email to the email address you used above head to this email and click the activation link.
- 6. Once you have signed into your account, click on the **'Pay now'** button in the top right-hand corner of your screen and follow the prompts.

PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW

 FREE INSTRUCTION Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL. Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school. 			
PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:			

Curriculum Contributions Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum. Other Contributions Voluntary financial contributions for noncurriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g., textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
